## **January meeting Report**


#### Competition

#### **Abstract Cityscape with Acrylic**

Using several layers of paint on top of each other, you'll get a highly textured and vibrant look. You'll also learn a glazing technique using a brush to apply the paint. There will be several demonstrations during the afternoon. Beginners or any skill level are welcome.
