




LAAC's Library Show is Open

Justice Vanguard Call for Art

Black and white paintings of any kind, any size

Justice Vanguard is a civil rights education foundation founded in Los Altos by a young black Los Altan, Kenan Moos. His mother was a black

physician and his white father was born and raised in Los Altos. He grew up being challenged by police and authorities when he walked from his Los Altos Avenue home to his grandparents' home in Los Altos Hills. He was a scholar and soccer star at Yale. He was named Los Altan of the Year in 2022 for his work in making Black Lives Matter films and documentaries about black history and for his teaching of civil rights and black history at regional schools.

His foundation is having a fundraiser on February 21, 5-8 p.m. at Los Altos Community Center. At previous Justice Vanguard events, works of Black Panthers other black artists has been featured, as wells the films the foundation has made. The February 21st community event is a fundraiser and will feature donated black and white work of local artists and photographers.

<u>Ilocano Traditional Weaving (hands-on)</u>

Wednesday, November 5, 1:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.

This program introduces the socio-cultural and historical significance of Ilocano traditional weaving within the Filipino American community. The practice is rooted in the migration of Ilocanos to the U.S. in the early 1900s, following American colonization of the Philippines. As the second-largest Filipino ethnolinguistic group in the U.S., Ilocanos carry a rich weaving heritage. Participants will explore iconic design patterns, their symbolism, and try weaving on small looms.

Tags at Venues

- <u>Click this link</u> to open a pdf and print the official tags (print them on card stock if you can, otherwise printer paper is fine). You can fill them in by hand or electronically.
- Artwork must display the official LAAC tag next to each artwork
- Prices should be included if the piece is for sale (otherwise, put "not for sale" on the tag)
- Make sure your contact information is legible and correct
- Printed tags can also be picked at our club meetings
