March Meeting Report


Member Presentations

Eric Greenhut, Gouache Painting with a Stained-Glass Look

Eric showed selections from his portfolio and talked about his history as an artist. He paints landscapes in plein aire, usually finishing the painting in one session. He paints wet on wet using 140-pound paper taped to waterproof foamcore (which keeps the paper flat) and likes to start with a horizon line. Julia Kahan, Stained Glass

Rona is hosting a reception at State Street Market in Los Altos on **Friday, April 19, at 6 p.m.** Her paintings will be displayed there from April 3 to May 13.

Acrylic Painting Techniques Workshop

University Art, 2550 El Camino Real, Redwood City Saturday, April 20, 1:30-4:30

Learn painting techniques using the wonderful, forgiving, and versatile medium of acrylic paint. There will be demonstrations using a variety of ways to apply the paint, including sgraffito, sponging, stenciling, layering, wet-in wet, and more. Students will apply these painting techniques to their canvas panel to create a sample board to take home to use in future



paintings. This is a great workshop for anyone new to acrylic or for anyone who wants to further their knowledge.

Supplies to bring: Three colors of heavy body acrylic paint; a light, medium, and dark hue, such as, yellow, orange, red or light blue, medium blue, dark blue. One inch wide synthetic stiff bristle brush with a short handle (long handle O.K.), one or two canvas panels "12"x16" (not stretched canvas), plastic stencil, paper palette, or a few paper plates or any palette you already have, water container, paper towels, pencil, eraser, ruler, black felt tip pen, palette knife if you have one, optionalapron.
